



In pursuance of an Order dated Ap<sup>l</sup> 3<sup>d</sup> 1769 No 1591 there was Surveyd for Elizabeth St Clair the above described Tract of Land containing three hundred and eighty nine acres with an allowance proportioned to Six P Cent Situate in Donegall Township in the County of Westmoreland Surveyd May 13<sup>th</sup> 1803.
