



A Draught of Land Situate in Heidelberg Township Northampton County Originally Surveyed in two tracts for Nicholas Kern viz: the Upper tract Containing 300<sup>a</sup> and the lower tract Containing 200<sup>a</sup> the whole being now divided in three tracts for William & John Kern agreeable to the above described Plan the Upper tract Surveyed for William Kern Containing One hundred & thirty four Acres & ninety perches and the Allowance of 6 P.Cent & C<sup>a</sup> being part of the 300 Acres tract The South Westerly tract was also divided for William Kern Containing One hundred and thirty six Acres & twenty perches & the Allowance of Six P.Cent & C<sup>a</sup> where of 11 Acres and thirty perches is also part of the 300 Acre tract and 124<sup>a</sup> 148 perches thereof being part of the 200 Acre tract.
