



By virtue of a warrant from the Proprietaries dated the Thirtieth day of October 1734 Surveyed unto Lotwick Layman a Tract of Land situate on Perkiomie Creek <sup>in old Cowissihoppin</sup> in ye County of Philada. Beginning at a White Oak standing on the west side of sd Creek thence by Vacant Land South West one hundred and sixty one perches to a post - thence by Vacant Land South East one hundred and forty one perches to a post thence by Vacant Land North East one hundred and one perches to a Spanish Oak standing on the bank of said Creek thence up the same to the place of Beginning containing one hundred and fifty acres with the usual allowance of six <sup>7</sup>/<sub>8</sub> Cent.

Surveyed Novem<sup>r</sup> 7. 1734.
