



The Draught of a piece or parcell of Land in the County of Lancaster (part of a Tract of 900 Acres laid out for Adam Gouldney with the allowance of six Acres to the Hundred for Roads) Situate on a branch of Tulpehocken Creek. Beginning at a White Oak Thence South South West 97 perches & a half to a post Thence North 77 Degrees West by ye Lands of George Knap Andrew Ellik and George Miller 152 perches to an Ash Thence North 21 Degrees West by the said Miller 88 perches to a Stake Thence North 73 Degrees westerly 5 perches to a post Thence North 5 Degrees East by the said Miller 89 perches to a post Thence South East by South by the land of Harris Seller 68 perches to a Gum Thence North East by East by the same land 134 perches to a post Thence South East by South by the same 60 perches to a Hickery tree Thence South West by West by Andrew Strickler 16 perches to a post Thence South East by South by ye same 81 perches & a half to the place of Beginning Containing One Hundred and Fitty Six acres beside the proportion of Allowance for Roads and Highways.
