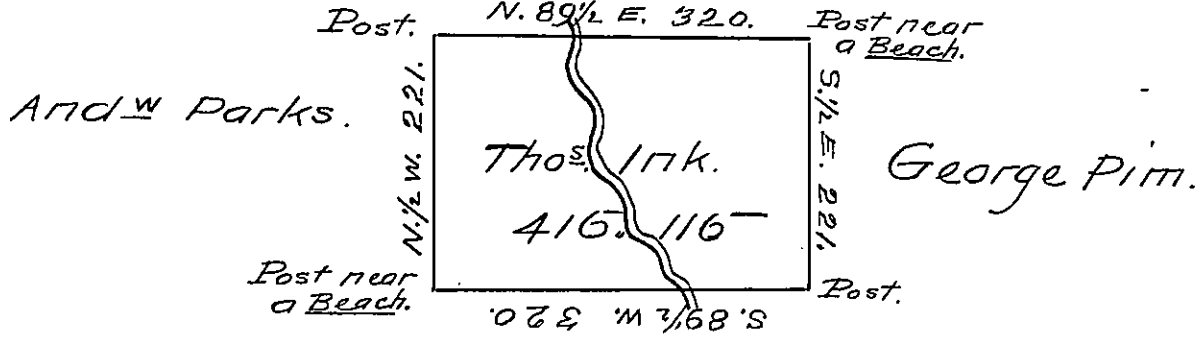

Situate on the waters of the east branch of French Creek in District No. 1 Surveyed the 8<sup>th</sup> day of June 1799 in pursuance of a Warrant in the name of Thomas Ink dated the 10<sup>th</sup> day of April and a Warrant of the Surveyor Gen<sup>l</sup> (upon an Order of the Board of Property) Dated 16<sup>th</sup> May 1799, 1793 containing four hundred & sixteen acres & one hundred & sixteen perches and the allowance of six per cent ~
