



Surveyed on the Tenth day of May 1729 to John Isaac Clyn a Tract of Land situate in the township of Salford in the County of Philad<sup>a</sup>. Beginning at a White oak sapling in a line of Henry Rudd's land thence by land of Derick Johnson North East one hundred and five perches to a post thence by the land of Hans Miar and Christian Stover South East two hundred and fourteen perches to a post thence by the lands of John Johnson and Gabreil Shoolar South West one hundred and five perches to a post thence by the said Gabreil Shoolar's land and land of Henry Rudd <sup>North West</sup> two hundred and fourteen perches to the place of Beginning. Containing One hundred thirty two acres with the usual Allowance of six p. Cent. Nich<sup>o</sup> Scull
