



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the Fourteenth day of March 1733 Surveyed unto Peter Helton a tract of land situate in Oley in the County of Philad^a Beginning at a Black Oak a corner of Owen Richards land thence by the same South Twenty Degrees West Eighty perches to a post thence by land of Solomon Cole South Sixty four Degrees East one hundred and ninety two perches to a small hickery and by land of John Alprick the same course Twenty four perches to a post thence by land of William Roberts & James Norril North Twenty Degrees East ninety six perches to a post thence by land of Lodowick Clapp North Seventy Degrees West one hundred and fifty three perches to a post a corner of 3^d Clapps land thence by the same North Twenty Degrees East Eleven perches to a post thence by land of Owen Richards North Seventy Degrees West sixty perches to the place of Beginning containing one hundred & Seven acres with the usual allowance of Six P. Cent. Surveyed April 20th 1734 by Nich^o Scull assigned to Michael Lodowick & now by Warr^t of ye 17th Nov^r ordered to be returned to his use.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this eighteenth day of August 1905.
