



By a Certificate under the Hand of Geo. Stevenson it appears that the above Described Tract of Land situate in Earl Township in the County of Lancaster, was (by Warrant of ye 11th Day of May 1744) Survey'd to John Lissynee January 23rd 1749/50 - but did not close Wherefore by a Resurvey thereof taken the 13th Day of ye 9th mo. 1766. the said Tract is found to be Bounded & Limited as above Described, Beginning at an ash Tree where Two Branches of Mill Creek meets & Extending thence up ye most Northerly of ye sd 2 Branches on ye several Courses about 50 Perches to a stone in Christian Sensenichs Line ye on De S. 36 E. &c.
