



By virtue of a warrant from the Proprietaries dated the Eighteenth day of November 1734 Surveyed unto Phillip LeBar a tract of land situate in New-Cowissitoppin—in the County of Philad^a. Beginning at a post in a line of the German Tract thence by the same South West Two hundred and ten perches to a White Oak thence by land of George Undeleigh South East Eighty one perches to a White Oak thence by Vacant Land North East Two hundred and ten perches to a post thence by Vacant land North West Eighty one perches to the place of Beginning Containing one hundred acres with the usual allowance of six $\frac{1}{2}$ Cent.
