



By Virtue of a Warrant from ye Proprietaries Dated ye first day of May 1733, Surveyed to Samuel Mickell in right of Rachel Crispin, a tract of Land Situate in the County of Philad^a. Beginning at a White Oak, a Corner of Christopher Beidler's land thence by the same N.W. 54 pches to a post, thence by 5^d Beidler S.W. 68 pches to a Hickery, thence by ^{ye} same N.W. 100 pches & by Vacant Land, ye same Course 26 pches to a Black Oak, thence by Vacant Land S.W. 216 pches to a Chestnut, thence by Vacant Land S.E. 180 pches to a post in a line of a tract of land laid out to Samuel Powell, thence by the same N.E. 284 pches to the place of Beginning. Containing 250 Acres with the Usual Allowance of Six $\frac{1}{2}$ Cent.

Surveyed May 27. 1735.
