

In Pursuance of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the twelfth Day of October A^o Dⁱ 1734 Surveyed unto John Miley A certain Tract of Land situate in the County of Lancaster, near the Head of Canestogoe Creek. Beginning at a marked White Oak near a small Branch of the said Creek Thence extending East by Land settled by Philip Carpenter, two hundred and forty four pches to a marked Chesnut. Thence by Land settled by Thomas Croyl, North North East forty six pches, East South East twenty pches to a marked Hickery, and North North East One hundred and seventy four pches to a marked Black Oak. Thence by vacant Land West three hundred and forty seven pches to a marked Hickery, and South One hundred and ninety five pches to the place of Beginning. Containing Three-forty seven Acres and the usual Allowance of six A^r C^t for Roads &c. Surveyed the 27th Day of October A^o Dⁱ 1735.
