 Oak. Thence North 78 Deg. East by James Brown 128 perches to a Post. Thence South 12<sup>d</sup> East  
 by Thomas Bell 12 per. to a post. Then North 78<sup>d</sup> East by the Same 54 perches to a Dog-  
 tree. Thence South 12 Degrees East by John Hill's Improvement 44 perches to a Black  
 Oak. Thence North 78 Degrees East by the Same 138 perches to a Dog-tree. Thence  
 South 12 Degrees East by the Improvement of James Murray 104 perches to a Spanish  
 Oak. Thence South 78 Degrees West 8 perches to a post. Thence South 12 Deg<sup>s</sup>  
 East by the Said-Murray & John Smith 58 perches to a White Oak. Thence  
 South 78 Degrees West by the Said-Smith 215 perches to the place of Beginning  
 & 69 perches
