 In the Township of Donegal—Beginning at a Marked Locust tree By the Side of Sasquehanna River thence North 31 Deg. East 356 per to a Black Oak thence West North West 87 per to a white Oak, thence North North East 11 per to a Black Oak thence West North West 40 per to a white Oak. thence South West by South 382 per to a Post. By the side of Sasquehanna River, thence Down the Several Courses of the said River 148 perches. to the place of Beginning. Containing Two Hundred ninety four Acres of Land with the Usual Allowance of Six acres Cent for Roads &c. Surveyed April the 11th Anno Dom. 1739.
