



By Order of the Proprietary Surveyed to James Mitchel A Tract of Land in the Township of Donegal in Lancaster County Beginning at a Corner Black Oak in the line of John Stewart's Land, thence by the Same South 57 deg East 154 per to a Black Oak Corner of Nathaniel Little's Land, thence North East by East 272 per: to a hickory, thence South 36 deg East 142 per to a post, thence North East by East 105 per: to a Black Oak, thence North 11 deg East 103 per to a Marked Birch By the side of little Chickasalunga Creek, thence North ~~34 deg~~ ^{34 degrees} West 170 per to a post, thence South 66 deg West 270 per to a Black Oak Corner of John Galbreath's Land, thence South 55 deg West 249 perches to the place of Beginning. The 100 ^{as} was granted to James Mitchel by Deed from James Logan part of 2400 ^{as} granted to James Steel by Warrt dated the 26th of March 1733 in right of W^m Markham one moiety of n^{ch} James Steel granted to James Logan.
