



By Virtue of a warrant from the Hon^{ble} Proprietaries bearing Date the twenty-fifth Day of Sep^{br} Anno Do/ 1738. I have Surveyd And Layd out unto William Hartly, Mercht in the Township of Hopewell, in the County of Lancaster on the West Side Susquehanna river. Beginning at a Post Thence South Sixty Degrees Easterly Two hundred and forty Six ~~perches~~ to a Hickery. Thence North Thirty Degrees Easterly, One hundred and Seventy Six perches to a Post. Thence North Sixty Degrees Westerly Two hundred & forty Six perches to a Black Oak. Thence South Thirty Degrees Westerly One hundred and Seventy Six perches to the Beginning. And Contains Two hundred and fifty ~~four~~ ^{five} Acres of Land with allowance of Six ~~per~~ Cent.
