N. B. The aforesaid land as surveyed for Daniel Knapp, who has since deceased, is to be patented to David M. Knapp, who claims the same, by legal transfers from the aforesaid Daniel Knapp, dec. and others as appears from the Records of said County. Whereas Daniel Knapp by Deed dated on the 16th day of July did convey to David M. Knapp one hundred acres of the aforesaid land & Recorded in Deed Book Y, page 112 & 13, August 12th 1845. Also one other Deed from James Titus dated the 25 day of March A.D. 1842 To David M. Knapp for fifty eight acres one hundred and thirty seven perches & Recorded
