



To John Laporte Esq. Surveyor Gen. of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

Sir:— In compliance with your Order of the 23^d of May A.D. 1849, I went on the ground as requested by James Kimball, on the 31st May, and made the resurvey. The survey made by Mr. Deane who was the Deputy Surveyor of this County when the Warrant was laid his (Mr. Deane's) survey was carried sixty perches to far West, thus interfering with Warrant No. 4468, in the name of James Wilson, and on running East he stoped at a resurvey line made probably for the J. Strawbridge tract, which line is forty perches west of the original line made for said Strawbridge, the Original line of said Strawbridge as now distinctly on the ground, counting sixty^{three} years old, and the resurvey line assumed by Mr. Deane more than twenty years younger. I therefore send you the above draft adjoining Straw-bridge, Wilson and others containing two hundred thirty four and one fourth (234 1/4) acres with allowance of Six per Cent
