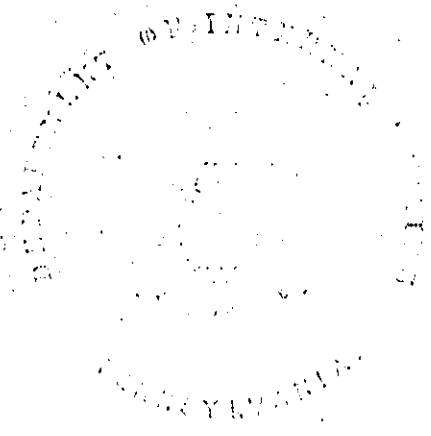

In pursuance of a Warrant dated March 20<sup>th</sup> 1776 was Survey'd for David McFee the above described Tract of Land Containing Two hundred and Eighty nine Acres & Eighteen perches with an Allowance proportioned to Six P Cent Situate on the South Side of Alleghany River Adjoining Land of Genl Butler and others in Pitt Township Westmoreland County Survey'd May 15<sup>th</sup> 1787.
