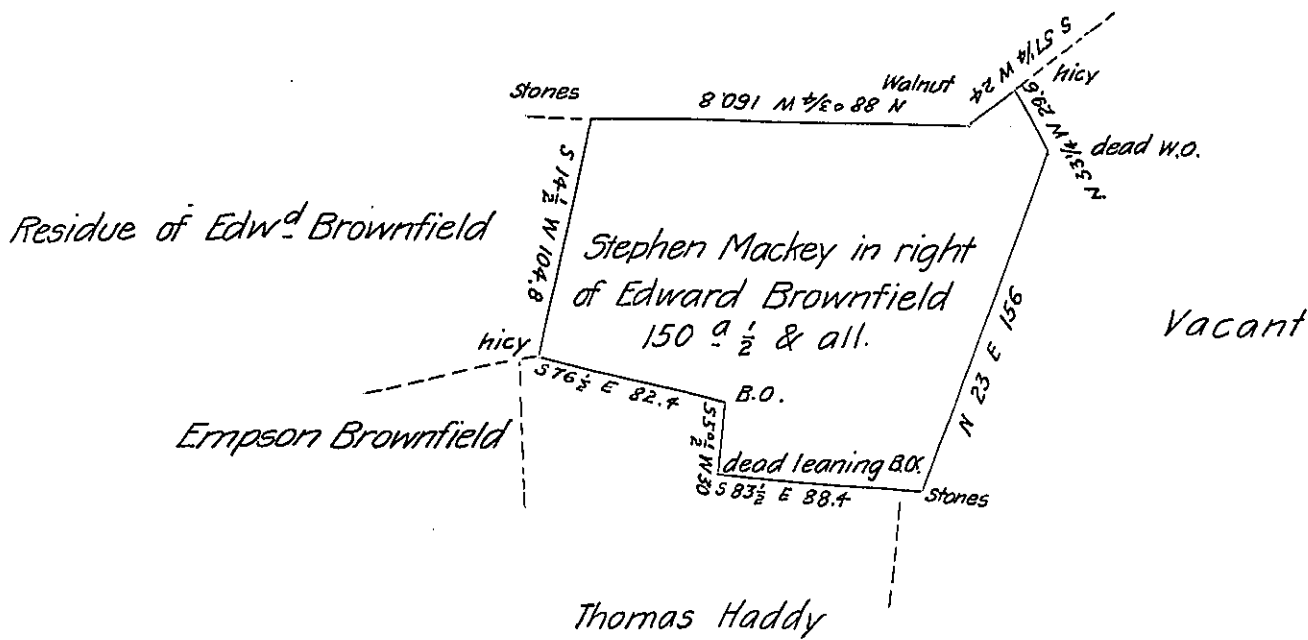


Thomas Gaddis



Situate on the Waters of Redstone Creek, on the West side of Laurel Hill now in Union & George Townships Fayette County formerly Cumberland County - is part of a Survey made by me for Edward Brownfield on the 26th day of September 1769. Containing 250^a 1/2 & allowance - Who afterward sold one hundred Acres & allowance, of the same to Robert Brownfield his Brother - who sold to Leonard White - since deceased - the heirs of Leonard White have formally released to John White the present possessor of the hundred acres - Who contemplated uniting with Stephen Mackey in procuring a Patent for the whole - and afterward transferring - Mr White is disappointed in means - Mr Mackey is urgent to procure his title - As the best method I could devise under the Circumstances - I send you a Draught of Mr Mackey's part now - And will forward Mr Whites as soon as he can be prepared - the Original Survey is founded on an Order of Survey N^o 3462 dated 14th June 1769
