In Pursuance of a Warrant dated the first day of February 1820 granted to Abraham Leasure was surveyed the 2^d day of May 1820 the above described Tract of Land containing four hundred & twenty three acres and eighty seven perches with the allowance of six per cent. situate in Buffalton Township Armstrong County North-west of the Allegheny River.

N.B. That George Shearer enters a caveat to the granting a patent for the part represented by the dotted lines including the Letter A for which he alleges he has the best right.
