



By Virtue of a warrt from y<sup>e</sup> Hon<sup>ble</sup> proprietaries bearing Date the six-Day of October anno 1738 I have Surveyd and Layd out unto Rob<sup>t</sup> McFarson on the branches of Marsh Creek on the west side sus-hanna river in the County of Lancaster Two hundred and One acres of Land with allowance of six P Gent Beginning at a Hickery Then South Eighty five Degrees Easterly one hundred & sixty perches to a white oak Then North twenty two degrees Easterly one hundred and Eighty Pches to a white oak Then ~~South~~<sup>North</sup> Sixty Eight degrees Westerly Two hundred and twelve perches to a post Thence South Seven Degrees and an half westerly Two hundred & thirty four perches to the place of Beginning.
