



By virtue of a Warrant bearing Date the 25th of February 1746, and an Order from John Lukens Esq: Surveyor General of the State of Pennsylvania to execute the same, was Surveyed on the 17th of December 1783 for Adam Meisner, A Parcel of Land near a Place called the Narrows, in Tenecum Township, Bucks County Beginning at a Stone standing by the River Delaware; Thence by John Frauls Land S 85° W 54.5 Perches to a Stone Heap; Thence by Lands of Peter Stover, Christian Root and Martin Oberholt N 4° 52' W 101 Perches to a Stone, Thence by the said Oberholts Land N 11° W 108 Perches to a Stone Heap; Thence by Matthew Hughes' Land N 86° E 26.2 Perches to a Chesnut Oak Tree standing by a Part of the River Delaware (Gutbitch Channel); Thence by the several Courses of the same Part of the River S 10° 35' E 138 1/4 Perches, S 16° 35' E 26 Perches, S 24° E 44 Perches and S 47° 15' E 12 Perches, to the Place of Beginning. Containing forty Acres and one hundred & seven Perches strict Measure.
