



Situate on Champion's run in Bulskin township Fayette county and surveyed the 9th day of November 1813, By order of Survey No 3538 dated the 23<sup>d</sup> of June 1769

Note -

John Shetler who purchased from Joseph Hoothance caveats two acres lying between the dotted line and the Northern boundary of the 65 acres. The grounds of his claim will be found in a decision of the Board of Property dated June 7th 1790. The survey was first made by Benjamin Lodge on the 22<sup>d</sup> day of October 1789 by which survey there appeared to be Three hundred and Sixty five acres but was never returned. By the present survey there are three hundred and Sixty seven acres, There being two acres of an overplus which Shetler claims, I have thought proper agreeably to my understanding of the decision of the Board of Property to lay off Sixty five acres to John Shetler and leave the remainder to John Muir.

Note, there is an Improvement on the ground of about 150<sup>sq</sup> And a person residing thereon.
