



The above is a true Copy of a Draught of a Tract of Land Survey'd by my Father for James Johnson in the year 1741, & Return'd soon after. The vacancy which Andrew Mcintire speaks of lies at Z & the Courses of McIlwaine's Survey between the ches. oak Corner & Saml. Simson's Line are as follows. Viz from the ches. o. 5.48° W 46 p to a stone 5.88° W 31 p to a hickery, & 5.76° W 40 ps to a hick in Saml. Simson's Line thence by the same North, to his hic. Corner (the distance I know not) & E. S. E. by Johnson's old Line to the Beginning. Perhaps the measure of those New Lines may not agree with the old ones so as to close 11th 11 mo 1765. Certify'd by
