



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietors Dated the 12 Day of January Anno Dom. 1737 The Above Described Tract of Land Was Surveyed unto Jacob Miller in the County of Lancaster. Beginning at a Chesnut tree Thence East by North by Vacant Land 142 perches to a post. Thence South by East by Vacant Land 220 perches to a White Oak. Thence West by South by Vacant Land 200 perches to a Black Oak. Thence North by West by Land Survey'd to Jacob Emerick 100 Perches to a Post. Thence East by North by ye Same Land 58 perches to a White Oak. Thence North by West by the Same and Vacant Land 120 perches to ye place of Beginning Containing Two Hundred & Eighteen Acres beside ye Allowance of Six p. Cent.
