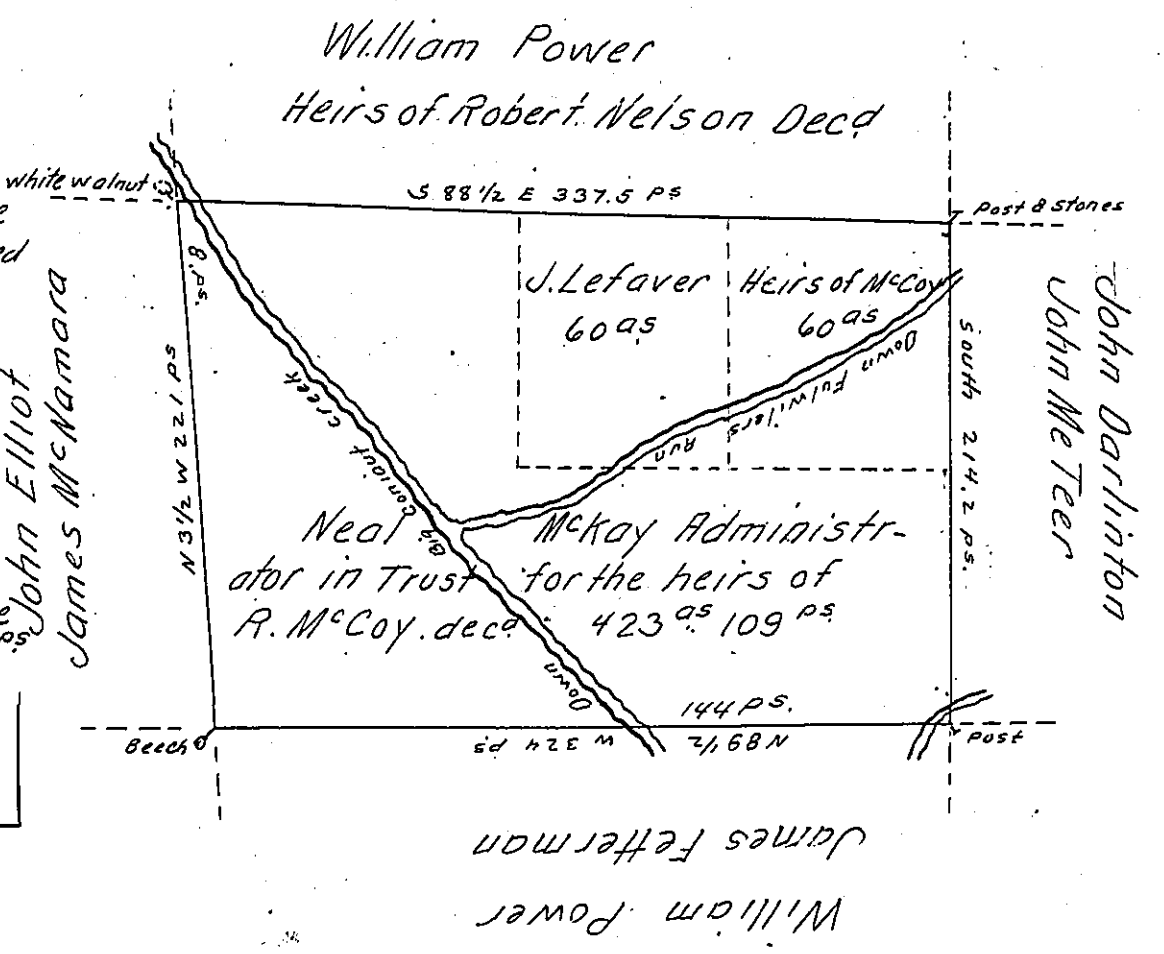

In pursuance of a Warrant. for 400^{as}. dated the 13th day of February A.D. 1810. Was surveyed the twenty second day of December A.D. 1815. for Neal McKay Administrator in trust for the heirs of Robert McCoy decd the above discribed tract of Land Containing Four hundred twenty three acres. one hundred nine perches. and Allowance of Six percent. for Roads &c. situate in Bever Township Crawford County Pa and at the time of surveying the same John Fulwiler - the Assignee of (Merideth Darlington the original holder) was Living thereon with his family and there appeared that he had Cleared fenced and cultivated upwards of of forty acres on his part of said tract - and that Jacob Lefaver was Living on his part of said tract and had a Large and valuable Improvement.
