Request of Hugh & William Penny the 15<sup>th</sup> 3<sup>rd</sup> mo 1786 & the said Particular Surveys included,  
appears to contain 214<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> & the allowance of 6<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> per Cent. Certify'd the 29<sup>th</sup> 4 mo 1786.
