



In pursuance of a Warrant granted to Samuel Maginnis dated December 14<sup>th</sup> 1815 Surveyed on the third day of May 1816 the above described tract of land called Donegal containing one hundred acres thirty one and three fourth perches and Allowance proportioned at six percent Situate in Donegal Township in the County of Westmoreland.
