



The first above described tract, containing 416 acres 168 perches & allowance of six per cent for roads &c. was resurveyed the 21<sup>st</sup> of September 1836; The North 346 acres 109 perches being for Hugh Montgomery and <sup>the south</sup> 70 acres 59 perches for Joshua Bowman and being the same tract of land that was surveyed on the 20<sup>th</sup> day of October 1802 on a warrant for 400 acres dated the 1<sup>st</sup> day of December 1801 granted to John Montgomery Situate in Vernon township Crawford county.

The last and south tract of land above described containing 444 acres (obl.) perches and allowance of six per cent for roads &c. was resurveyed on the 2 (obl.) day of September 1836, for Joshua Bowman, it being the same tract of land that was surveyed the 20<sup>th</sup> day of October 1802 for Esek Fitz Randolph in pursuance of a Warrant for 400 acres dated the 1<sup>st</sup> day of December 1801 Situate in Vernon Township, Crawford county.
