We the Commissioners appointed for adjusting the Claims to unpatented lands in the Counties of Monongalia, Yohogania and Ohio do hereby Certify that Jacob Coleman is entitled to four hundred acres of land in the County of Monongalia on the waters of Dunlaps Creek to include his settlement made in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and seventy also a right in preemption to One thousand acres adjoining thereto

Given under our hands at Redstone old fort the Seventeenth day of December 1779 in the fourth year of the Commonwealth
