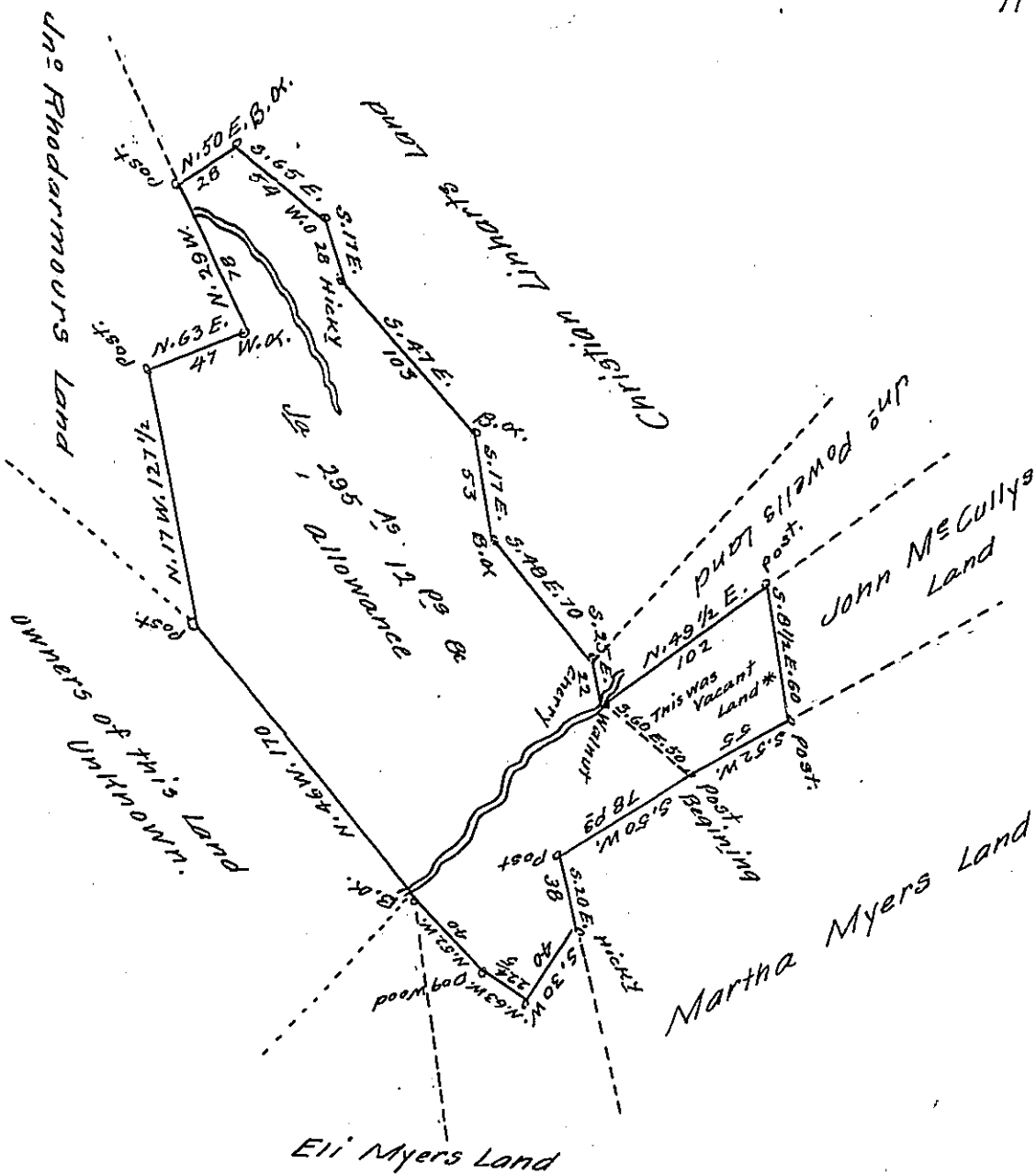

The above Described Tract of Land was Surveyed in pursuance of a Warrant granted to James Myers for 300 acres of Land dated March 7th. 1786, said land was surveyed By obl. Moore D. S. of Allegheny County But he did not fill the Warrant by 29 acres Two years ago. James Myres deceased hi His widow Requested me to run in a small piece of Vacant Land which was ~~joining~~ joining her land, The owners of the Land which lay round the vacancy came forward and said their warrants was all full and had no claim to it. At the request of Mrs. <sup>Susanah</sup> Myers I surveyed August 18th 1809 the above described piece of Land\* containing Twenty four acre & Twelve perches with allowance of Six per ct for Roads, 270 <sup>As</sup> <sup>ps</sup> 157 was in the former survey, The whole amount 295 <sup>Acres</sup> <sup>Perches</sup> 12 & allowance.
