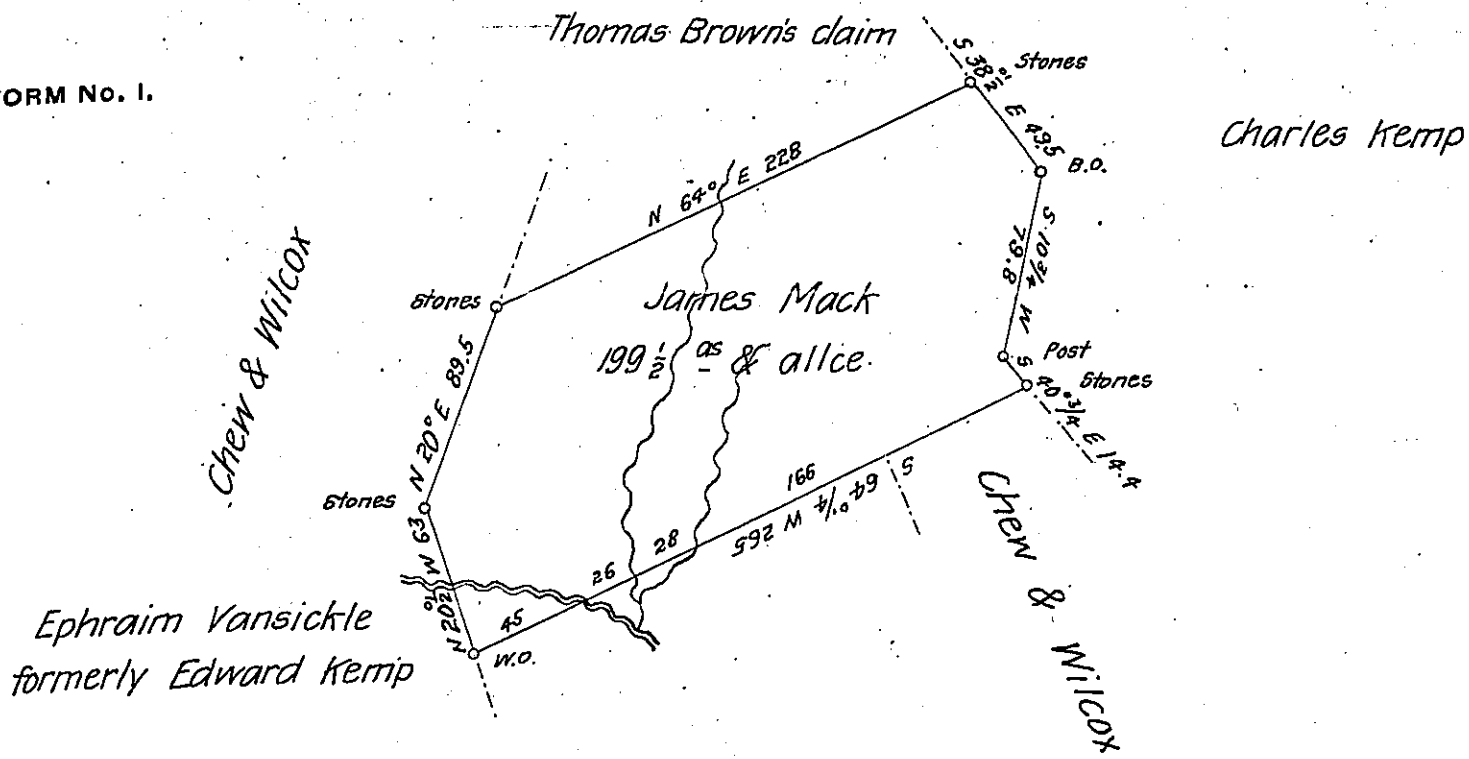

Situate on Halls Run in Henry Clay Township Fayette County & Surveyed the 8<sup>th</sup> day of April 1834 In pursuance of a warrant in the name of James Mack for 200 acres of land dated the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1834 There is about 30 acres cleared a log house & Barn and a family residing on this tract said to have been settled 30 years or more.

Uniontown 18<sup>th</sup> October 1834

Mr. Spangler, Sir. Thomas Brown who desired a Caveat to be entered against the acceptance of the Survey of James Mack 199 1/2 as upon warrant of the 18<sup>th</sup> March last in Henry Clay township Fayette County has just now called at my office and requested me to inform you that he wishes to withdraw his said Caveat & desires the patent may issue to Mack for the land, as the dispute between them has been amicably settled.
