



By virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietor Dated the Eleventh day of January Anno Dom. 1734. The above described tract of Land was surveyed unto Henry Nealy in the Township of Hanover in Lancaster County. Beginning at a post by Manaday Creek then up the same 122 perches to a Spruce, Thence Near the Improvement of Joseph Willson the five several Courses, Viz: South 77 Degs. West 6 per. to a Chestnut oak, and West, North West 46 perches to a post and South 60 Degrees West 140 perches to a Black oak North 30 Degrees West 20 perches to a Chestnut oak, and South 60 Degrees West 112 perches to a White oak thence South 30 Degrees East by Joseph Hutchison's Improvement 80 pers. to a White oak, thence East by South by the Improvem^t of Robert Snodgrass 28 pers. to a White oak, thence East North East by Robert Parks Improvement 47 perches to a Beech on a small Run, then down the same 250 per. to a Spanish oak thence North 64 Degrees East 11 perches to ye place of Beginning. Containing one Hundred & Ninety five acres beside the allowance of six p.
