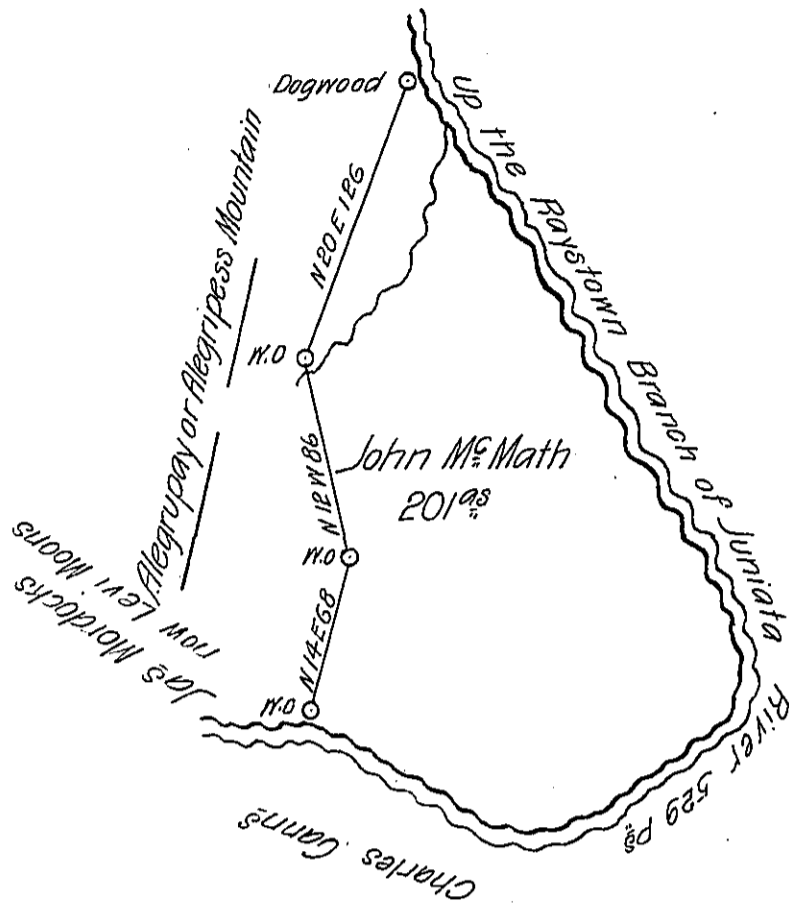


The Courses and distance up the Branch from the Dogwood to the W.O.

Surveyed the first (obl) of May 1792 in pursuance of an Application to John McMath No 1214 dated the 13<sup>th</sup> of September 1766
