



Surveyed on the 4th day of March 1733 to Francis Parvin a Certain tract of land situate near a branch of the River Skulkill called Runderihelea about Ten Miles West from Oley in the County of Philad<sup>a</sup>. Beginning at a Corner Post of Mary Hockleys land thence by the same <sup>North</sup> ~~South~~ Sixty Degrees <sup>East</sup> ~~West~~ two hundred & forty Perches to a Post thence by Vacant Land South Thirty Degrees East one hundred & fifty eight Perches to a post, thence by Vacant land <sup>South</sup> ~~North~~ Sixty Degrees <sup>West</sup> ~~East~~ two hundred & forty Perches to a Post, thence by Vacant land North Thirty Degrees West one hundred & fifty eight perches to y<sup>e</sup> place of Beginning. Containing two hundred & twenty five acres with Usual Allowance.
