



By Order of the Proprietary Surveyed on the 30<sup>th</sup> day of March  
 Anno Dom. 1738 to Grace Peden a tract of land Situate in the township of Hempfield  
 in the County of Lancaster. Beginning at a White Oak by the Side of Sickasalunga Creek  
 in the line of John Speer's land, thence South 43 deg: East 129 perches to a Black Oak  
 thence North east 72 perches to a Black Oak, thence North 16 deg: West 153 perches to a Horn  
 Beam Standing by the Side of the a<sup>sd</sup> Creek thence down the Several Courses of the s<sup>d</sup>  
 Creek 256 perches to the place of Beginning Containing one hundred & twenty acres  
 and the allowance of six acres P. Cent for Roads & Highways.
