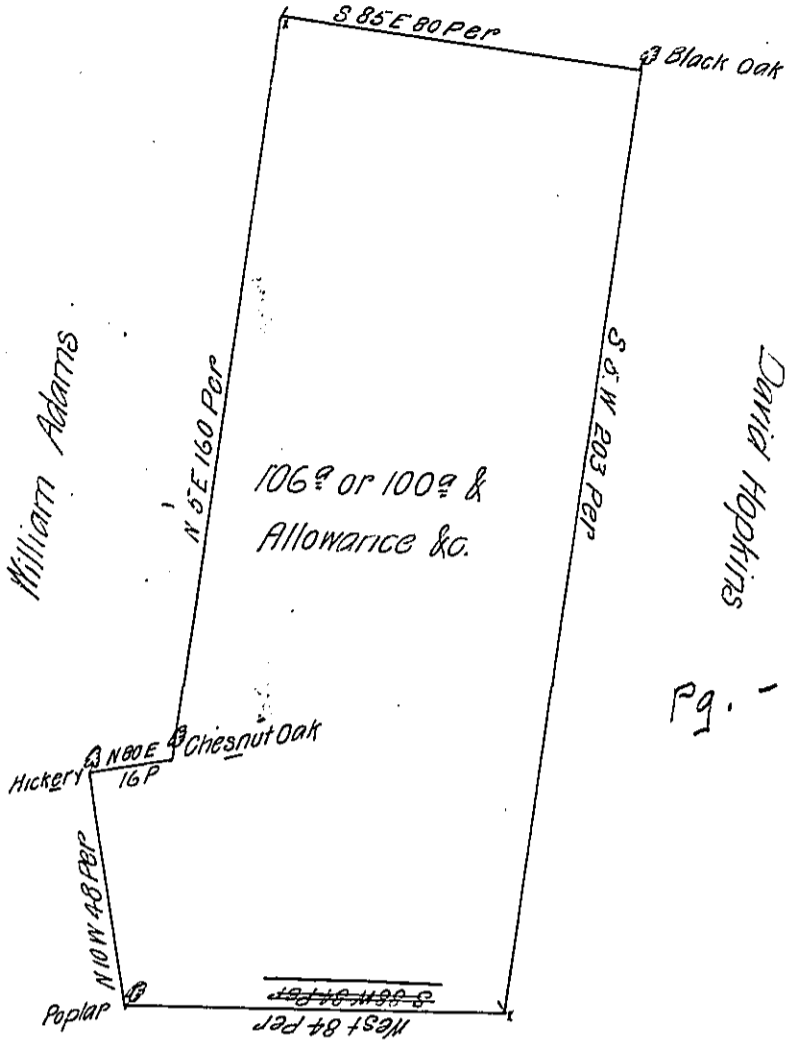

Pursuant to the Proprietary's Warrant dated the 4th day of June Anno

Dom 1739. and according to the Surveyor Generals Direction I have Surveyed & Laid out
 a tract of land for John Plain upon Pidgeon Creek, Beginning at a corner Mark^d Chesnut
 Oak, thence by William^s Improvement North five degrees east one hundred & sixty Perches
 to a post thence by John Niders land South eighty five degrees east eighty Perches to a
 corner Black Oak, thence South five degrees west two hundred and three Perches to
 a corner Post thence ~~South eight~~ ~~North eighty degrees~~ West eighty four Perches to a Corner Poplar
 thence North ten degrees west forty eight Perches to a Corner Hickery, thence North
 eighty degrees east sixteen Perches to the Place of Beginning. Containing one
 hundred & six acres. including allowance.

Survey'd the 8th day of ye 4th month call'd June 1739.
