



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the 27th day of February Anno Dom 1734. Surveyed unto Rudolph Pollinger a certain tract of land of Cocalico Creek in the County of Lancaster. Beginning at a Small Black Oak thence extending by Abraham Wolf's land S 10 W 10 1/2 Pches to a Post at a Corner of Matthias Ulan's land thence by the same South East 135 1/2 Pches to a small black Oak & 36 7/2 East 70 Pches to a Small black^{Oak} at a Corner of Ludwig Plum's land, thence by the same North 62 deg^s East 123 Pches, thence by Weirly Bentz's land North 15 deg^s West 26 Pches to a White oak tree & North 40 deg^s East 44 Pches to a Post, thence by Vacant land North 75 deg^s West 178 Pches to a Hickry North 60 deg^s West 40 Pches to a Hickry & North 55 deg^s West 80 Pches to the place of Beginning. Containing 192^{ac} 113 Pches and an allowance of 6 P Ct for Roads &c. Surveyed the 20th day of April A^o Dⁱ 1739 by
