



This tract of land Resurveyed at the request of John Parsons beginning at a Whit-oak stump formerly being the Corner of Benjamin Clarks land then North five degrees west fourer hundred and sixty eight Pearches by the said Clarks land to a Small-Whit-Oak then South west one hundred and fifty five Pearches to a black oak, then South one degree East three hundred Sixty Six Pearch-by John Parson other land which was Henry Bakers to a Post then South West twelve Pearches to a Post by a Whit-Oak then South east sixty pearches to a Post then North East eighty Pearch-to a Post then South east Sixty Pearches to a Post then North east forty Pearches to a Whit-Oak. then North west thirty seven Pearches to the Place of Beginning. Containing three hundred and fifty eight acres of land lying in Wrights Town in Bucks County. Resurveyed on the 18 day of the 10 month by - 1735
