



Joseph Pugh's Land Situate in the township of Uwchlan in ye County of Chester. Beginning at a Hickery tree then by Nathan Phipps land east by north one hundred fifty nine perches to a Black Oak. thence by Vacant land north north west one hundred & forty Perches to a Post in the line of Ann Thomas's land thence by the same land West sixty Perches to a Black Oak Saplin- thence by land late of John Evans South West twenty one Perches thence by the same land North West thirty one Perches to a Post thence by Jonathan Pugh's land south west by south two hundred & eight Perches to a heap of Stones thence by Tho^s Pratts land south east fourteen Perches to another heap of Stones thence by Vacant land north seventy three degrees east one hundred and one Perches to a Black Oak. thence south South east fourteen Perches to the Place of Beginning. Containing one hundred ^{Forty Five} ~~fifty nine~~ acres and allowance of Six P Cent. Surveyed ¹⁷⁴² 5th of ye 2^d mo April by

this land was surveyd by Isaac Taylor 8th 20th 1720 & returnd ye 6th Febr'y 1741 into the Sec^r's Office & Patented to Jos. Pugh according to ye Pricked Line. but upon Resurvey made by Richard Jones as above the true Bounds of the land are found to be as shown by ^{the} black line & the same is accordingly returnd into the Secretary's office.
