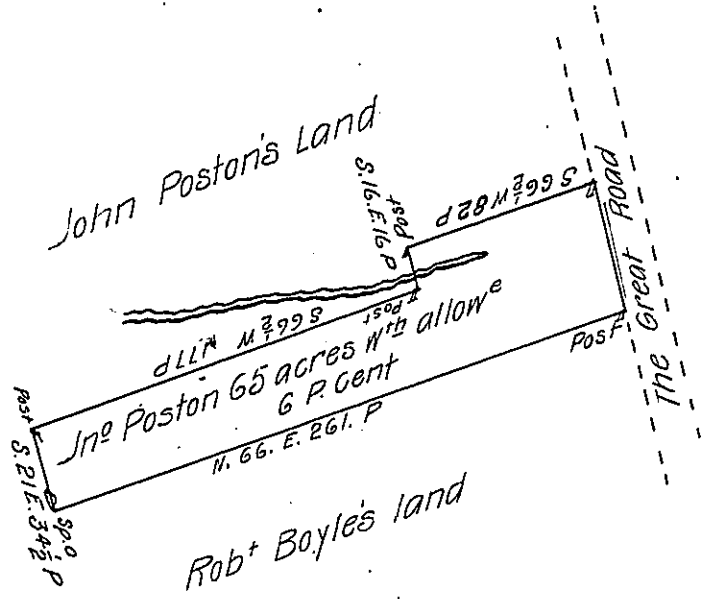


Willm Buntings Settlement



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Honble Proprietaries bearing date the  
fourteenth day of March Anno Dom. 1733. I have Surveyd unto John Poston in  
the Township of ffallowfield in the County of Chester. Sixty five acres and thirty two  
perches with allowance of Six P. Cent. Beginning at a Post by the Great road  
leading to White Clay Creek Landing. Thence South sixty six degrees Westerly  
eighty two perches South sixteen degrees easterly sixteen perches South sixty six  
degrees Westerly one hundred and seventy seven perches. South twenty one degrees  
Easterly thirty four perches and an half to a Spanish Oak. North Sixty six degrees  
Easterly two hundred and Sixty one perches to the Said Road and by the  
said Road near about forty Six perches to the Place of Beginning  
Surveyd April 6<sup>th</sup> /1741
