



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries to me directed bearing date the 28 of Novemb^r A. D. 1743. Survey'd unto Caleb Pierce a tract of land situate on Octoraro in the township of Sadsberry part whereof in ye County of Chester & part in the County of Lancaster. Beginning at a White oak tree a corner of Caleb Pierces other land & also a tract belonging to ye heirs of James Wister deceas'd thence by ye land of ye sd James Wister east north east 34 perches to a small black Oak thence South South East by Vacant land 128 Perches to a White Oak thence South South West 67 Perches by Vacant land to a Chesnut Oak thence West North West by Vacant land 76 Perches to a Chesnut thence North by Vacant land 44 Perches to a Black Oak thence East by Vacant land 40 Perches to a White Oak thence North North West by Vacant land also 100 Perches to a White - Standing in a line of Caleb Pierce aforesaid thence by his land east by north 14 Perches to the Place of Beginning. Containing 60 acres & $\frac{1}{4}$ and allowance of 6 P. Ct for Roads &c. about 27 Whereof in the County of Lancaster. Survey'd on the 7 day of December. A. D. 1743 P^r
