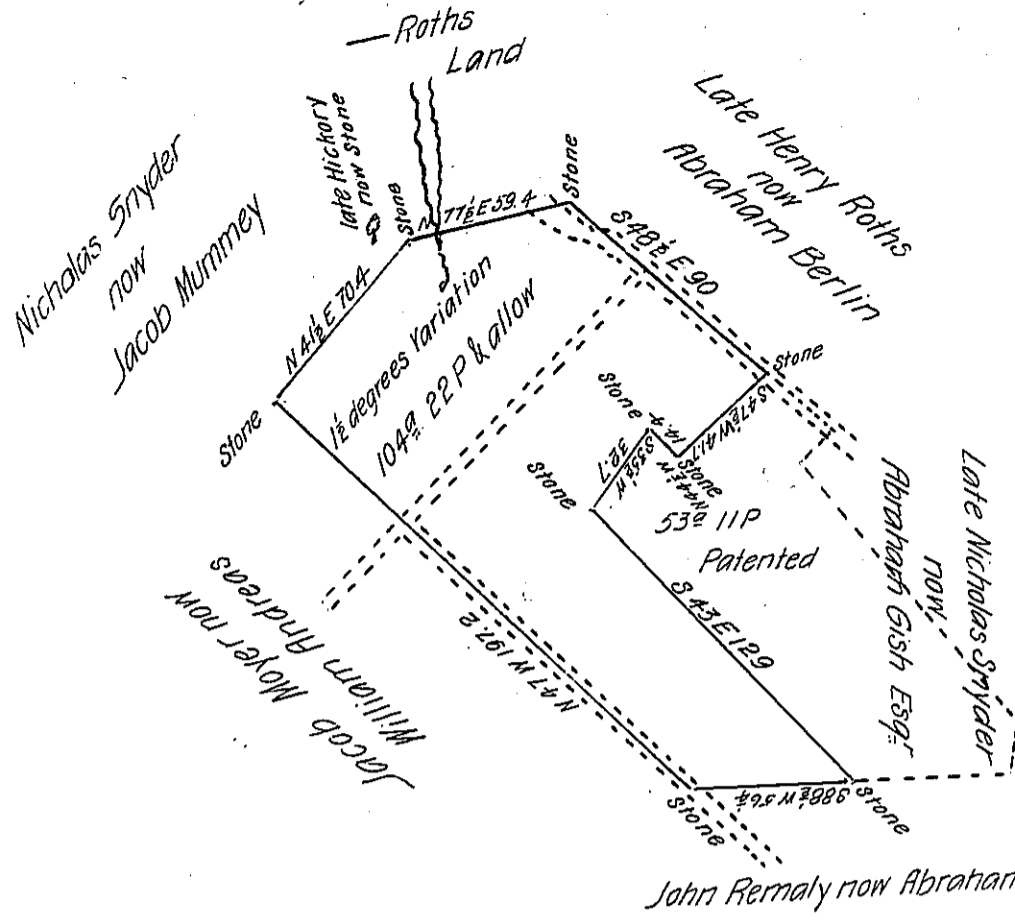

 Whereas by two Certain applications one of them dated the 5 day of August A. D. 1765 No. 214 granted to Nicholas Snyder, the ~~one~~ other dated 25 day of September 1765 No. 957 granted to the said Nicholas Snyder. Surveyed the 20 day of March A. D. 1837 unto Peter Master containing yet one hundred and four acres and twenty two perches and the usual allowance of six per cent for Roads &c. Situate in Lehigh township Northampton County. This being the residue and overplus of the two applications. I have marked on the above draft by dotted lines which part of it is patented already of those two applications which you can easily perceive, and for this overplus the Patent will immediately be taken out after the Return is excepted. For to Survey is seperate of the two applications the residue unpatented land (it is an impossible thing to do I have runed the lines and found the corners right and thought this way it certainly would be correct The land is improved very much and is cut up in at least 5 pieces already
