



In pursuance of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the 22^d of October Anno Dom 1735. Surveyed unto Cunrade Sharff. A certain tract of land situate in the County of Lancaster on a small branch Suetara Creek. Beginning at a Post at a corner of Peter Glubb's land thence extending by the same South eighty degrees west (ob)l)nety eight Pches and a half and north ten degrees west fourteen Pches and three quarters to a Post, Thence by a Small Tract of land laid (ob)l)ut to Charles Fell and Guilelma Maria his Wife, South eighty degrees West Sixty Pches to a Post, North ten degrees West seventeen Pches and a half to a Post, South eighty degrees west twenty Pches to a Post, North ten degrees West One hundred and two Pches to a Post, and South eighty degrees west sixty Pches to a Post, Thence by Vacant land South ten degrees east eighty six Pches to a Small Hickery, South eighty degrees west seventy Pches to a Small Black Oak, South ten degrees east eighty four Pches to a Post, North eighty degrees east two hundred and ten Pches to a Post, South ten degrees east fifteen Pches to a Post, North eighty degrees east ninety eight Pches and a half to a Small Hickery, and North ten degrees West fifty Pches and three quarters to the Place of Beginning. Containing One hundred and fifty acres and the usual allowance for Roads &c
