



Situate in Tyrone Township Adams County Surveyed Nov. 29<sup>th</sup> 1816 in pursuance of a warrant granted to James Dickson for 7<sup>ac</sup> dated February 22<sup>nd</sup> 1816 containing five acres thirty one acres & allw. on which there is an old improvement and claimed by the neighbours for a school house or as a residence for a school master, it having been held, they say, for that purpose nearly from the first settlement of the Country and occupied as a school house or for the use of a school master who would teach in a school house near to it, they also alledge that James Dickson obtained possession of it under them as a tenant, the land is now all clear and I believe was all cleared before James Dickson got possession of it.
