



A Draught of a Survey called "the double dispute" situate on the Waters of Montours run in Washington County (now Alleg. County) Containing 304 Ac. and the usual allow^d. for Roads &c. executed Nov^r. 21st 1786 in Pursuance of a Warr^t granted to Samuel Potter for 300 Ac. dated Dec^r. 14th 1785.

The Space to the East (coloured Green) exhibits an interfering claim survey'd by Mess^{rs}. Redick & Hoge Dp^s on a Warr^t granted to Jn^o. McAdoo dated Jan^y. 14th 1785.

The space in the S^e West corner (of a reddish colour) is part of a Survey made by the same gentleman on an early Warrant in the Name of David Scott. the white space containing 62 Ac. 153 p^s & All^o is all that is clear of dispute for the Warrant in the Name of Sam^l. Potter. From the Books of Nevill & Richie D.S^{rs}.
