Note. It appears that A certain John Vance had sold (what is here called the Good Will) of the above Tract of Land, unto another certain John Vance and received a consideration for the same; on which it is said at that time there was a small cabbir, and as yet appears, there had been about two acres in some measure cleared, but at present is almost grown up as if it never had been so. There is now and which hath been lately erected a small cabin of logs on the tract but without cover, but by whom erected is I find uncertain & which I presume, was done with intent, either to revive or set up a claim. On the whole, the tract hath been in a waste state, during the space of about eighteen years past except the cabbir, or erection aforesaid, and is claimed as I am informed by Grace the widow of the said John Vance deceased and the children of the said John Vance. The said Grace being now intermarried with One William Hannah. Farther it is said, that the said John Vance deceased, had died seized of an estate to the value of Five Hundred Pounds, and Queere why was not this land (if theirs) and it deemed then of any value, taken notice of by the Executors or Administrators, during the course of eighteen years.
