



In pursuance of an Order from the Commissioner of Property dated the 16<sup>th</sup> day of June 1772 a survey was made on the 3<sup>d</sup> of July following of a certain Lot of ground in the Town of Sunbury in the County of Northumberland, numbered in the General Plan of said Town sixty five and granted to Samuel Maclay, containing in Breadth East & West sixty feet, and in length North & South Two hundred and thirty feet. Bounded Eastward by lot number sixty six Northward by Mulberry Alley Westward by River Alley and Southward by Shamokin Street as by the general plan of said town remaining in the Surveyor General's Office will appear.
