



The above is a draught of two tracts of land situate forty six perches from each other on the waters of Chartiers creek in Chartiers township Washington County surveyed the 29th day of March 1824 in pursuance of two warrants ^{granted to Joseph McNight} both dated the 7th day of January A.D. 1822. tract No. 1 marked A. contains eleven acres and one hundred and forty two perches and allowance of six pr. ct. (The warrant is for 12 1/2^{as}) No. 2 marked B contains twelve acres and one hundred and twenty six perches and allowance of six pr. ct. (The warrant is for 11^{as}) No. 1. is principally cleared and under fence and is claimed by the said Joseph McNight by virtue of an improvement made by his father Hugh McNight in the year A.D. 1796, the other is wood land.
