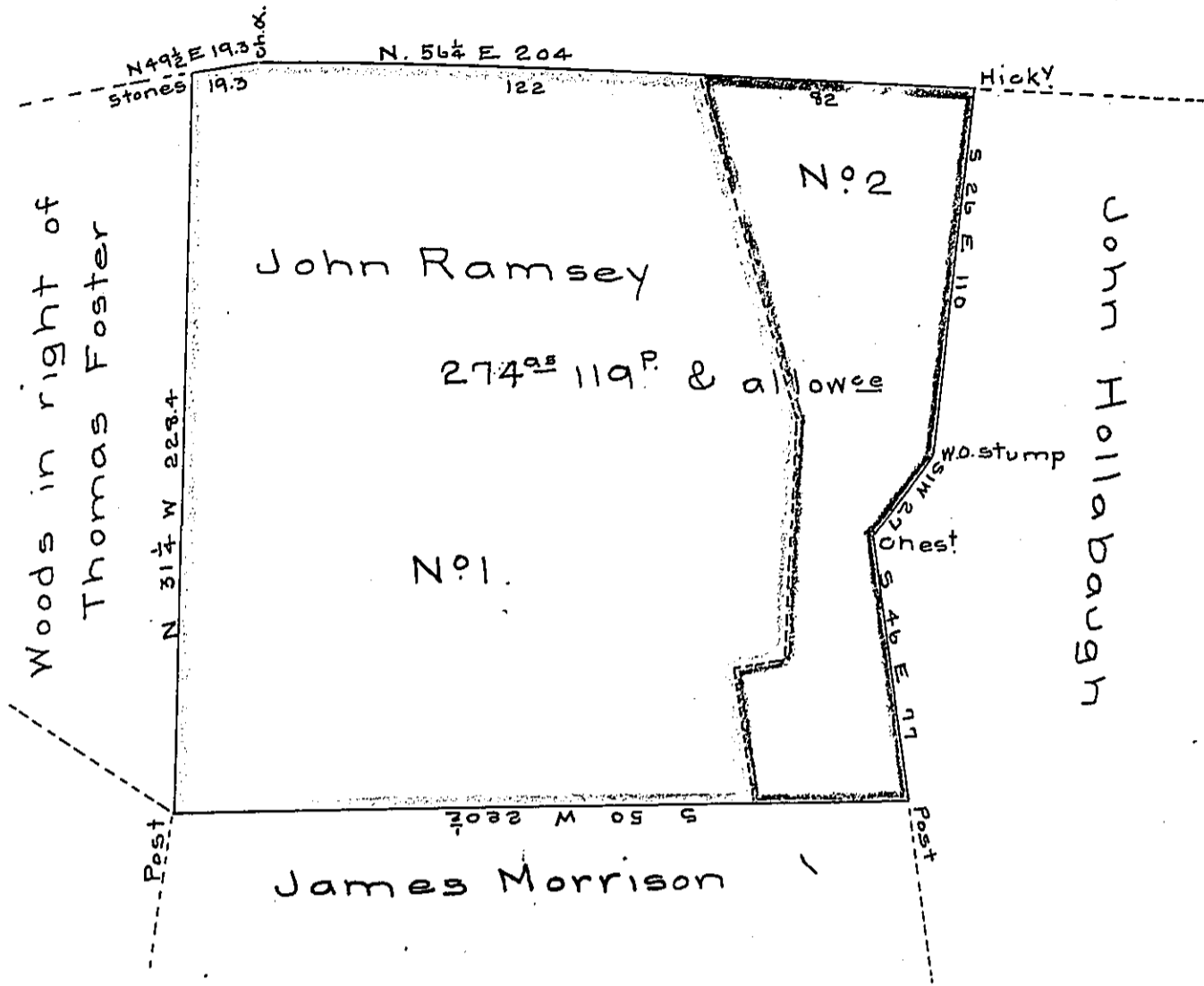


Conecocheague Mountain



Draught of a tract of land situate in Tobyne township  
 Perry County containing two hundred seventy four acres 119<sup>p</sup>  
 & allowance of six per cent for roads &c. Surveyed November  
 the 14<sup>th</sup> 1832 in pursuance of an order granted John Ram-  
 sey for 200<sup>a</sup> dated August the 12<sup>th</sup> 1767 & Numbered 4286.  
 Jacob Spangler Esq<sup>r</sup> S.G.      by W<sup>m</sup> Wilson D.S.

Note - The above part in yellow lines N°1 contains 222<sup>as</sup>  
 143<sup>p</sup> & allowance surveyed in pursuance of a warrant gran-  
 ted to James Morrison dated May the 6<sup>th</sup> 1793 - The part  
 within the green lines N°2 contains 51<sup>a</sup> 145<sup>p</sup> & allowance  
 surveyed on a warrant granted James Morrison dated  
 August 24<sup>th</sup> 1814 for 75<sup>as</sup> and is now owned by said James
